Nu'uanu YMCA **Receives \$5M Gift**

he YMCA of Honolulu at the corner of Vineyard Boulevard and Nu'uanu Avenue has been a landmark since 1963. Now, thanks to a \$5 million donation from The Clarence T.C. Ching Foundation, it is starting a far-reaching transformation to become a modern community hub that will address the community's most pressing needs.

"For years, the YMCA has envisioned a reimagined Nu'uanu YMCA as an inclusive, welcoming space where youth, kūpuna, families and individuals can connect, stay active, build resilience and thrive," according to a statement from the YMCA. "It will be a place that not only serves people within its walls but also acts as a central hub, expanding outreach into surrounding neighborhoods and communities"

In 2021 and 2022, the YMCA conducted market- and community-based feasibility studies with input from donors, community leaders and neighbors. The studies confirmed a strong desire for the Nu'uanu Y to serve as a central connector to meet the needs for

Parks Permit Office Moves To Sheridan

The City and County of Honolulu Department Parks and Recreation's Permitting Office has moved to the two-story building at Sheridan Community Park (833 Pi'ikoi St)

"Along with making the Parks Permits Office more accessible to the public, this move will help further activate Sheridan Community Park by bringing more daily activity and foot traffic," states Laura Thielen, director of DPR. "This office worked with our on-site park staff to issue 14,408 park use and 8,603 camping permits last fiscal year (from July 2024 through June 2025). So, giving them a physical location within a park, while also exploring ways to expand and enhance our digital services online makes sense"

- · Conduct any organized activity, such as sports tournaments, meetings or workshops.
- · Reserve the use of recreation facilities, including While a park permit is fields, gyms, rooms and

pools (no private parties allowed)

- · Have a group picnic of 50 people or more.
- Utilize/set-up large structures, such as inflatable bounce houses.
- · Drive any vehicle on grassy areas.
- · Play or amplify loud music or use loudspeakers.
